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2014 Pinot Noir Fog-Eater Anderson Valley AVA

Fog-Eater is a regional term used by the early settlers of Anderson Valley. During this early history these settlers created a regional dialect that is better known as 'Boontling'. Fog-Eater is a pejorative term used to describe a coastal dweller; someone living out on the margin.

This year we added the Filigreen vineyard site to this blend. Located on a lower bench next to a tributary of the Navarro between Philo and Boonville, the Filigreen vineyard brings savory red fruit character and fine grained tannins to this wine. The Balo Vineyard adds a darker element along with subtle floral and mineral tones. Together they form synergy for a lovely example of what Anderson Valley can do.
